<p>Draw a picture of All Saints Church and label it. (etc steeple, door, clock) you can write or if that's a bit tricky get an adult to write it for you.</p> <p>Draw a picture about something you did at the weekend. Get an adult to help you write a sentence about what you did.</p> <p>In autumn, many people celebrate a good harvest with a Harvest Festival. Draw and label a list of some of the foods that farmers grow on their land.</p> <p>Using sticky notes or pieces of paper, can you challenge your child to try and label objects in your home, trying to sound out each word? E.g - bed, kettle (k-e-t-l), fridge (f-r-i-j).</p>	<p>Use some paint to make handprints of everyone's hands in your family and then cut out the handprints. Can you put them in order of size from the smallest handprint to the largest handprint? If you haven't got any paint, you could draw around hands instead!</p> <p>Can you do some cooking and measure out the weight of the different ingredients?</p> <p>Get 10 pieces of paper and write numbers 1-10 on them. Muddle them up and see if you can put them in the correct order. If you want to challenge yourself do it up to 20!</p>	<p>Talk to someone at home about what you would like to do when you grow up. Try and find out a little bit more about it by talking to people who know about that role or looking in a book or on the Internet. Then, you can share what you have found out with the class.</p> <p>Write a list of three things you can do to help you to stay healthy.</p>	<p>Go on an autumn walk with a grown-up and collect some autumn leaves. Use these leaves to make a picture or collage.</p> <p>When you get home, sit quietly and listen carefully to see what you can hear. Draw pictures of some of the things you could hear in your house or garden.</p> <p>Create portrait of your family using any media you like!</p>	<p>Practice learning your sounds and try and think of words/or find objects that start with these sounds.</p> <p>How many words can you think of that start with s and a?</p> <p>Challenge: How many words can you make out of the letters s,a,t,p,i,n,m,d</p>
